Whole-of-Government Policy Guidance

UBHub's Urban Butterfly Effect policy brief calls on national governments to accelerate local actions to meet the Global Biodiversity Framework (GBF) targets. The brief harnesses our database to identify how local actions collectively enhance biodiversity.

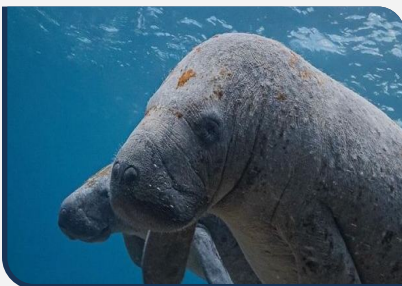


Indicators & Indices Expertise

UBHub developed the IUCN Urban Nature Indexes (UNI), a framework for cities to measure their impact on nature. The UNI guides decision-making and supports cities of any size and context to report their progress. We also support UNI application.

Facilitation & Knowledge Synthesis

As a core partner in a consortium led by the Science-Based Targets Network (SBTN), UBHub convened and facilitated experts and practitioners to develop the guiding structure and analysis for the Nature Positive Cities Science-Based Targets.



Government Partnerships & Tools

UBHub helps governments develop tools for local progress towards GBF Targets, such as our partnership with Keystone Species Alliance (KSA) and the Government of Quintana Roo, Mexico to develop innovative strategies for urban biodiversity.
